SOMETHNG CREATIVE TO DO

Bunny Gilbert of the Huron Area Photography Club read an article about taking photos with three different filters to create an unusual effect.

You need a red, blue, and green filter, a camera capable of making in-register multiple exposures on a single frame of film, a sturdy tripod, and any color slide or print film suitable for the lighting conditions at hand.

Your next step is to find an appropriate subject or location. An ideal situation is one in which some objects remain stationary during the three exposures, while others move. Because the film has 3 layers, the stationary objects will be in normal color while the moving objects will take on

a multicolored appearance. Some examples would be clouds, water, etc., anything that includes both moving and stationary objects will produce the desired effect.

Meter the scene to determine a normal exposure and set your camera at that. Take three separate exposures on the same frame of film, one through each of the colored filters. Be sure to allow enough time between exposures for moving objects in the scene to change positions. Try bracketing the exposures and vary the time between exposures to create different effects.
