PSA has International Photography Exhibitions for Color Projected Images (slides and digital), Electronic Imaging (digital images), Nature (slides and digital), Photo-Travel (slides and digital), Photojournalism (slides and digital), Pictorial Prints (large prints and small prints) and Stereo (slides, stereo cards and electronic images).

A few Nature, Photo-Travel and Photojournalism Exhibitions may also accept prints. Some times the Exhibitions may have more than one section, as examples in the Color Projected Image area you might have an Open or General Section and a Creative Section and in the Nature area you might have an Open or General Section and a Wildlife Section. One of the requirements of an International Exhibition is that the exhibition must prepare a show of all accepted entries and show it in the local area at least twice before returning the accepted images to the exhibition entrants.

Kaposia Memorabilia

It appears that St. Paul CC member **Herb Gustafson**, Hon. PSA is the unofficial historian for Kaposia CC. Recently he furnished another bit of memorabilia dating back to 1967 when he served as annual competition judge.

The item was a lengthy 2-page scroll relating to the club's activities for the year, including council and PSA interests, plus the annual salon winners were noted receiving blue and red feathers for their award and HM status.

Since the club name derives from local Indian lore, further attachment included the cover sheet - wallpaper that simulated birchbark, and attached to a wood dowel with leather thong. It was an impressive "keeper" souvenir.

Previously, Herb provided a hectograph copy of their (unknown published) bulletin from their 1960-61 season when he was a member and officer, accounting for a revised time-line for their present-day bulletin publication.

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PROBLEMS BROUGHT TO MY ATTENTION November 2006

1. SENDING PRINTS BY LIBRARY RATE AND/

OR MEDIA RATE. The United States Postal Service says that N4C, even though N4C is a non-profit educational organization, does **NOT** qualify to use the Library Rate and/or the Media Rate to send photographic prints to contests.

Because of the size and weight of print packages, they must go to the Postal Clerks when the Contest Chair takes them to the Post Office to return the prints to the club N4C Contact Person. The Postal Clerks will charge the First Class (or Parcel Post) Rate to return the prints which is about double the Library Rate or the Media Rate. The Contest Chair must pay the difference between the Library and/or Media Rate to return the prints to the contest entrants.

One N4C Contest Chair has had to pay more than ten dollars (\$10.00) to return prints. I would suggest that if Contest Chair Persons encounter this problem that they then return the prints with a Postage Due sticker on the print package to the entering club.

This problem, if it continues, will discourage clubs from wanting to judge contests that involve judging prints. PLEASE DO NOT USE LIBRARY RATE OR MEDIA RATE TO SEND PRINTS TO THE N4C CONTESTS

2. N4C HANDBOOK AND DIRECTORY. The information contained in the *N4C Handbook and Directory* is **NOT** to be posted in any form on any web site, nor is it to be available for internet downloading by any means.

PLEASE CHECK YOUR CLUB WEB SITE TO MAKE SURE THAT NO PART OF THE N4C HANDBOOK AND DIRECTORY IS ON YOUR WEB SITE.

The N4C Board has authorized that, Section J – Contest Rules and Definitions and the Digital Pictorial Slides – Provisional Rules, will be allowed to be on the N4C Web Site only.

from Cental Iowa Camera Club Sharp Focus:-

Intermediate Photoshop Techniques

Besides providing instant results, digital photography lends itself to a number of tools capable of improving an image or matching it better to the photographer's "minds-eye." The photographer's vision may even evolve into an artistic rendering of the image. Adobe Photoshop CS2 is one of the popular computer software packages providing an array of tools with an endless number of techniques for uses in photography and art.

Ken Johnson of the Central Iowa Camera Club selected landscape and scenic photos and demonstrated using Photoshop CS2 to make drab photos pop. That included removing colorcasts, improving contrast, boosting color saturation, and overcoming poor or uneven exposures. There are several techniques for fixing washed out skies and adding clouds. Tools for blurring and sharpening details can also be used effectively.

In his demonstration Ken made use of layers for pixel data, and also features such as adjustment layers, and layer masks. The objective was to improve the basic image incrementally in a non-destructive manner. Using layer techniques allow each modification to be turned off and on, and tweaked later in the process. The original image is always on its own layer available for reference. Layer masks are valuable in limiting the modifications, when necessary, to a selected portion of the image. Ken also touched on converting color to black and white.
