Nikon introduced its first consumer digital camera only twelve years ago. In an October 1997 review, *PC Pro* Magazine naively declared, "Digital cameras may seem like a bit of a fad, given that they tend to be fairly low resolution or ridiculously expensive." The Nikon Coolpix 100 had 0.3 megapixel resolution and stored 19 photos at that resolution! It cost around \$1,000. See it at http://www.nikonweb.com/coolpix100/

PSA's 2008 Conference Awards

N4C past president Edgar Lower was accorded the Society's advanced service honor - its Fellowship. Wichita Area CC member Mary Ann Rhoda, FPSA was presented with its Service Award Gold Medal. The Society's ROPA/Recognition of Photographic Achievement - Proficiency distinction, was conferred upon Shutterbug CC'er John Larson, Jr. and St. Paul CC member James Duncan, APSA. Previous N4C recipients of ROPA honors include: Edgar Lower, FPSA and Connie Lower, APSA of Color Shooters CC with its advanced honors - Efficiency/EPSA ranking, and the Proficiency/PPSA by St. Paul CC'er Herb Gustafson, Hon. PSA, FPSA.

The establishment of ROPA in 1997 evolved from 2 1/2 years extensive effort with overseas international exhibitors and national photo groups in 15 countries by Herb Gustafson, thru service contacts maintained as Overseas News editor and with the Int'l. Affairs Comm. For the express purpose of rewarding Society exhibitors with PSA photographic honors, since overseas exhibitors preferred acquiring FIAP photo distinctions - NOT, Star Ratings! A similar program was previously rejected in 1987 and again in 1991 by a former Society president, who claimed it was - UN-WORKABLE, but yet acquired an E-ranking.

I attended 2 field trips. The 1st was a night shoot. Even though we were in different cars and left at different times without discussing destinations; Jean and I wound up at the Stone Arch Bridge at the same time! We found our way down to the water and stayed so long we had to wade out. We also had to explain to out of towners why the water was rising so fast at the lock.

The 2nd was a trip to the Landscape Arboretum. I brought my recently converted to infra-red digital camera and had a lot of fun playing. Jean is a member and said she has a couple of passes. We will try to put together a club field trip when we come back from out west. The fall color should be good at that time.

N4C members also got to sit in on a seminar John Gregor was giving for gardeners who want to get into taking pictures of their gardens and the plants there-in. I thought he had a really good approach to explaining things so that some one new to digital SLRs could easily understand.

What particularly stuck in my mind was the sideXside comparison of various jpeg sizes compared to raw. He took a landscape photo at small, medium, and large jpeg as well as raw. He then cropped the

same central portion on each, blew up to 8X10, and displayed them next to each other. Even the large quality jpeg wasn't quite as sharp as the raw image. He attributed this to the fact when the camera saves a jpeg it throws away pixels and when the image is opened in an editor program those pixels must be made up. It's a good exercise to give someone who isn't sure about raw to try out. RAW will need be processed sharpened same amount as camera pre-set sharpens jpg to compare fairly.




