Greetings lovers of the lens,

One of the benefits of participating in N4C is getting to know a lot of interesting people. As a contest judge, contest chair, bulletin editor, directory editor, or officer - to name a few – we see a lot of names mostly through contest entries and N4C contacts. Then what a pleasure it is at Springbrook and Conventions to actually meet each other. Such was the case a few weeks ago when 79 of us met at Springbrook – 12 for the first time, 41 from Iowa, 30 from out of state, 21 clubs represented. We had some outstanding programs and slide shows. We took a historical tour of Scotland with Hope & Gerry Solomons, and the next evening went to Iceland with Ed Siems and Teresa Vokoun – what great shows. I wish you all could have participated in John Larson's program on how to meaningfully critique – a lesson on how to express ourselves when judging. Bob Rude and Linda Rutherford showed some interesting photo editing techniques. Owen Johnson set a high standard when he described all the doors his photography has opened by volunteering. Our DNR program was outside and demonstrated the capture, banding, and release of birds for study & research. New this year were a dozen experts on various topics set up like small consulting businesses – answering questions and offering their knowledge as we moved from station to station. Gerald Bonsack demonstrated extraordinary panoramas on the computer – being able to turn around 360 degrees, up, down and zoom in & out. Would we expect any less from him? Thanks Gerald (Jerry) for organizing the program schedule this year. Always interesting is getting to see all the photo essay entries. We wound up the weekend on Sunday morning with 14 of those excellent shows – The judges will have a challenge to pick the best ones for awards at the Des Moines convention.

The Des Moines Camera Club extended the invitation to attend the N4C Convention September 6-8, 2012 in Des Moines. You will find a link to that information on the N4C web home page. Member Deb Bates was elected Director 6 on the N4C Board for next year, and is also serving as a Print Contest Chair. They've judged contests the last two years and will judge three again next year. Club Bulletin/Communication Contest Deadline Extended

The N4C Board voted to extend the annual Club Bulletin Contest deadline to June 1 with the hope of getting more clubs to enter. The question is how does your club communicate? Is it a mailed or email bulletin? Is it a blog or website? N4C clubs are urged to enter one form of communication from the current competition season for judging. The entry should be representative of the club's best communication work. Judges will be looking at quality of the content, style, neatness, methods, and reproduction quality. Awards will be announced at the N4C Convention and points will accrue toward the Club of the Year Award. Springbrook Time Lapse Video

Springbrook provided the opportunity for me to try time-lapse photography for the first time. You can see the results with a link to the YouTube video on the web: http://n4c.us/meetings.htm. My Nikon cameras have a built in "Interval timer shooting" function. I can set a start time, an interval between shots, and the number of shots (up to 999). I chose one shot every second. This meant I could capture the action (999 photos) covering about 16 minutes. I wanted HD video resolution (at least 1080 pixels high) so was able to do this with small-fine jpg image quality. To make the movement look smooth, the recommendations of cinematographers is to set the shutter speed to about 1/3 of the interval. I used 1/2.5 sec shutter speed and adjusted the ISO and f/stop in manual mode to give me the correct exposure – and set focus to manual. I was able to do this while inside, however when outside for the group photo I had to use a neutral density filter to get the slow shutter speed that I wanted.

I really got enthused about trying this when I discovered that Photodex Proshow slide show software could be used to turn a folder full of time-lapse photos into a video and output it to a variety of formats. It was so easy to select them all and drop them in the time line. All the slide times were set to zero – yes "0". Cross fade was the transition used between each and here is where the timing was set to 0.06 seconds for each transition. This gives a run of 16.7 frames per second and gave me the look I wanted (16 minutes of shooting condensed to 1 minute of video). You can vary the transition time to your satisfaction. I saved the individual time-lapse sequences as Quicktime H.264 1080p '*.mov' format. I then assembled those video clip sequences into the final show with some still shots of the bird banding and saved the final show again as a Quicktime H.264 1080p '*.mov' before uploading to You-Tube. I could also have burned it to a DVD or even a Blu-ray DVD.

Most tutorials on the internet suggest putting the time-lapse together with Quicktime Pro which must be purchased. Many of us already have Proshow Gold or Producer and I found it is so easy to use it. I suspect you can accomplish something similar with iMovie on the Mac.

IMPORTANT: All prints MUST BE MOUNTED (on a stiff backing) for this annual contest. For loose prints they must be mounted on a stiff backing for year end display at the convention. Secure the loose print to the stiff backing by either double sided tape - across the top edge of the print or hinge them along the top edge, so the original print tag can be seen.

All prints received for this annual contest will be displayed in a convention salon and slides will be projected for those attending the convention.

Awards for the Best of the Best will be announced and presented at the N4C Convention banquet on Saturday September 8 along with Photographer of the Year, Clubs of the Year and other awards.

Thanks go to all the entrants, clubs, judges, and contest chairs. We will judge around 5,900 photos this year! Thanks also to Diane Darnielle who has kept the records of winners during the year.



Contest Update for 2012-2013

The contest lineup for next year requires 80 monthly judgings in addition to the annual contests. There are a few new rule changes you should know about.

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- 1. Inter-club contests will be held each month, except June, July, August, and December. Competition will be in the following categories:
 - a. Digital Pictorial
 - b. Digital Nature
 - c. Digital Creative
 - d. Digital Travel
 - e. Digital Journalism
 - f. Digital Black & White (November & March only)
 - g. 2 x 2 Slides
 - h. Color Prints
 - i. Nature Prints: Black & White or Color
 - j. Black & White Pictorial Prints
 - k. Creative Prints
 - 1. Travel Prints
 - m. Journalism Prints
 - n. Photo Essay Annual Contest will be held in April
 - o. Panorama Print Annual Contest will be held at the Springbrook mini-convention.
 - p. Camera Club Bulletin (Communications) Annual Competition

Several changes affecting contest names to simplify and clarify them were approved at Springbrook – The word "slides" will be reserved for 2 x 2 Slides. Digital contests will, in general, be called "Digital Image" contests. Since all our contests involve photos, the word "photo" seemed redundant and now they will be simply 'Travel' and 'Journalism' digital and print contests.

The following rules for slides were approved. Note that slides made from digital files are no longer eligible in this contest now open to all subject matter.

Rules for 2 x 2 Slides

- 1. A 2 x 2 slide is a film transparency in a 2" x 2" slide mount to be viewed by projection on a screen.
- 2. Slides are made from a photographic film transparency exposed within a film camera or copies of such film. Slides made from digital files are not eligible.
- 3. Slides may be composed to suit the maker's wishes by cropping within the 2 x 2 slide-mount format.
- 4. All entries are judged as a single open category. Pictorial, nature, travel, journalism, creative, and other photographs are competing against each other.

Journalism entries may now include "sequences" in both digital and print contests. "Journalism means simply the telling of a story by the use of a picture, or a sequence of related separate pictures arranged for presentation as a single entry."

A special <u>Digital B&W contest</u> this year, hosted by the Des Moines Club received 90 entries from 23 clubs. With this popularity, two Digital B&W contests will be sponsored next season - one in November by the Iowa City club and another in March by the Des Moines club.
