Long time N4C member Ed Lower was in attendance and will be receiving two major PSA awards. The Grand Master (GMPSA) award will recognize his 3,321 acceptances in PSA (not a typo, that's *three thousand three hundred and twenty-one images*)! He is also receiving the Doscher Award for Traditional Photography which is given to any PSA member who shows excellence in photographing a variety of classical subjects. George Bebout will receive the FPSA (Fellow) Award which is awarded for exceptional service to PSA and photography.

In order to help folks who want critiques, study groups will be reinstated but instead of shipping images to each other this will be done electronically and probably use closed groups in Facebook. Comments on Comments:

Due to the large volume of digital camera images causing comment making to be very onerous; to the point that some clubs were threatening to leave N4C if required to judge, it was voted at the September Gen. meeting of N4C to eliminate or make comments optional; effective immediately. As an example, I asked my own club judges to comment on lower scoring images and let the higher scores speak for themselves. It is hoped that this will make clubs more willing to judge digital in the coming years. Please bear this in mind when I contact you to find out your judging preferences in November.

For those wishing to get critiques of their images; the board strongly encourages the resurrection of the study groups. These small groups provided an excellent teaching tool when they were in use for slides and prints as they provided much more in depth critiques. They could be conducted via email or online as each group prefers. One suggestion as an email round robin would be to have a file in which you place one image and email to the next person to critique each image that they receive and add one image on their own and send on to next person in the group. When it comes back to you take out your image and critiques of it and replace with a new image. A word doc could have 1 page for each image that the group members add their opinions. Ideally; they would consist of members from multiple clubs, not from your own club(to provide new perspective) and members typically had one week to critique images. 



A discussion took place within the Board of Directors about Facebook and I think rather than trying to re-write those thoughts I would just take them verbatim and share them with you.

From immediate Past-President Scott Udey regarding Facebook

1. Only post photos that are not competition photos and promote N4C and its member clubs. Having a direct link to the N4C website and winners gallery could be a good way to prevent giving up intellectual rights to members winning images.

2. The use of the N4C Facebook site can be a positive way to show off what our conventions clubs are doing. The images that Rick has posted is an excellent example of what visitors/ friends should see.

3. Any questions post using offensive language or images will be reviewed by a committee and removed if deemed inappropriate representation of N4C's mission. I think this could be the other tricky aspect. Offensive is a subjective call.

From Dwight Tomes

The positives for Facebook are it's ease in uploading photos, and a great venue to encourage participation in photography. The negatives are the ability of <u>anybody</u> to lift your work for their own use including Facebook who retains the rights to work. For my posts I often use the "almost" entry level material and I always prominently mark my photo's with my identity simply so it would be at least a little more difficult for someone to use without asking. A restricted group (i.e. member of N4C or as in our club's case) also means that the more limited distribution gives some protection.

From Joe Kubala

When I spoke up at the last Springbook outing concerning Facebook ... this is my concern. I suggest all become very familiar with section 2-1 of the Terms of Service for Facebook ... any intellectual property (photos and videos) ... that are posted on the NCCCC Facebook page ... become the property of Facebook for the duration that the information is posted or until the page is closed. The last statement in this section ... states that this license to Facebook continues after account closure ... if any of the intellectual information still exists with other Facebook users that originated from the NCCCC page. I know of a case where Facebook used photos for advertising purposes ... due to their "license" to intellectual property ... this was without any reimbursement to the maker of the photographs. This is my only concern with the NCCCC Facebook page ... that NCCCC members are aware that they are relinquishing basically all rights to their images as soon as they choose to post them on Facebook.

The Annual N4C Convention is an opportunity to see the entire monthly awesome award winning N4C contest images – all the slides, prints, and digital images. In this issue is a list of those winners.
