Greetings Everyone,

Here in Yuma, Arizona where my wife and I spend the winters, I have been having a lot of fun photographing Turkey Vultures. The opportunity presents itself just about every morning and evening when they're roosting in a tree, next to our RV Resort, along an irrigation canal and walking trail.

Why they like this particular tree is unknown because they feed exclusively on carrion (dead and decaying animals) and on our daily walks I have seen no evidence of any dead animals. There are lots of ducks in the canal and I've seen coyotes, rabbits, road runners and cats but I have learned they are not capable of killing live animals. There are days with as many as 30 or more

birds hanging out, some with wings wide open taking in the warm Arizona sunshine.

What's nice is that they apparently aren't afraid of people, as their tree is right along a heavily used walking trail, and as such are providing some excellent photo opportunities. No need for a blind to hide in, just a camera and a medium to long range lens.

I've seen many Vultures back home in Sioux City, Iowa but have never been able to really get close enough for some good shots, so this is a real treat. Close observation of this bird isn't very pretty but in the air it's amazing how graceful and majestic this creature is.

Here are a few fun facts I have learned about this astonishing bird.

· They have a bald head so bits of carrion (dead meat) won't stick to their skin as it would to feathers.

- · They got their name because their naked head resembles a turkey
- They are the only scavenger bird that can't kill their prey
- · They have an extraordinary sense of smell. They can smell carrion from over a mile away.
- · Aircraft pilots have reported seeing Turkey Vultures as high as 20,000 feet and can soar for hours without flapping their wings.
- · There average age is guessed to be around 20 years.

Shooting animals and birds in the wild for me has always been pretty difficult but you never know when an easy opportunity like this will present itself so always be prepared for the unexpected.

IF YOUR CLUB ENTERS PRINTS, SEE BELOW FOR WHERE TO SEND ENTRIES.

FOR DIGITAL ENTRIES, they must be received by 5:00 pm March 15, however make every effort to send them by the 13th to allow time for confirmation.

- Judging may begin on the 16th - make sure you receive confirmation that entries were received.

The cutoff time will be 5:00pm on the 15th giving the judging chair time to organize them for judging starting on the 16th. The point is....don't wait until the last minute. There have been problems with occasionally missing entries when they are not received until late in the night on the 15th.

There are six Digital Image Contests each month - (see the definitions of each category in the Rules):

Altered Reality (DA)
Black & White (DB)
Journalism (DJ)
Nature (DN)
Pictorial (DP)
Travel (DT)

Maximum of 8 entries per club per contest, not more than one from a member in each contest

Do not enter versions of the same image in multiple contests. For example, do not enter both a color & B&W version in the same month. If both win, one will be withdrawn. The rule is: "Any entry which receives a 1st, 2nd, 3rd, or HM award in a monthly competition may not be re-entered in the same year or later years, in the same or any other category, regardless of variations or changes made."

Please check your entries before sending them on for judging. Look for three things:

- 1. File size 750KB max. (A requirement this year)
- 2. Longest side 1,920 pixels max.
- 3. File name should look like this example: 01,DE028,DP,Beautiful Sunset.jpg

Content of the Email Message when you send the entries:

- a. Subject Line of the Email should say "N4C Contest Entries from (your) Camera Club".
- b. Specify which monthly contest and how many images are attached to the Email.
- c. List the Member Numbers and corresponding member names to ensure that the Judging Club has that information.
- d. Give the Club Name and your full name.
- e. Attach the image files

A club will normally have up to 8 entries for a contest. A typical image file name list might look like: (USE YOUR CLUB NAME AND MEMBER NUMBER INSTEAD OF DA044 - zero "0" 44 not a letter "0") (USE DA, DB, DJ, DN, DP, or DT for the Contest Code - This example is for the Digital Nature Contest) (Notice commas separating the data in the file names) 01,DA044,DN,Deer.jpg 03,DA022,DN,Grand Arch.jpg 04,DA033,DN,Teton Reflection.jpg 05,DA037,DN,White Water.jpg 06,DA002,DN,Shadows.jpg 07,DA025,DN,Horsetail Falls.jpg 08,DA018,DN,Soaring Eagle.jpg

Members should submit entries with filenames similar to the above except for the sequence numbers. The club N4C Rep will rename the files to include the sequence numbers. The club N4C Rep may want to keep things simple for the club members and handle ALL the file naming - how this is done is left to the club. The sequence numbers will determine the sequencing of the image in the judging line-up. All the contest entries will be sorted in alpha-numeric sequence by filename so this will mix up club entries for judging. The 01's from all the clubs will be judged first and the 08's at the end.

Quick JUDGING tip from the

Southwest Iowa Shutterbugs Camera Club:

When judging prints, I enter the entries from the different clubs using the digital software. Just as you would a digital image..... number, Club member number, type of contest, Title of image......01,SP001,NP,TITLE

......02,SP085,NP,TITLE. Etc.



This saves so much time!!! You have plenty of time to enter comments, and when it comes to scoring the final points, the Software does it for you. We can concentrate on the images, not waiting to get the scores and comments down.

Each judge is given a dry erase board and marker. TCI is written across the board, they write their scores down. The score keeper faces the judges. Each judges score the im-

age. Their board are situated so that other judges can not see. After judges scores are recorded, Discussion is held and comments given.

We prefer the TCI method, because it is a better learning tool for the image maker and for our selves. You understand better where the image stands, whether Technical, the composition or the interest.

Then record, print the judges report, do your merge and send to the clubs or tape to the print with ribbon and sticker.
