#### Doug Conrad's President's Notes:

Greetings Everyone,

For many of our member camera clubs, May and June marks the end of their meeting schedules until they start up again in September. That doesn't mean everything comes to a halt, however, as numerous clubs will offer opportunities for members to get together during the off season with organized outings and field trips.

The Sioux City Camera Club, for example, recently participated in a workshop held at the Henry Doorly Zoo in Omaha,

Nebraska. Prior to opening the gates to the public, members were instructed and guided during the 2 hour early admis-



sion. It was an opportunity for everyone to get together and photograph the animals without having to navigate crowds of people. Opportunities like these are out there if you take the time to look for them and ask. If your club isn't doing these sorts of things I would encourage you to consider it.

It's also the season where the days are longer and the nights are warmer so a lot of you will be spending more hours out and about as well as traveling to some of the country's most beautiful destinations. Just keep in mind that different seasons call for different approaches, so your summer photography will most likely require some adjustments. Here are some things I have found that hopefully can make this season's photos better.

- 1. Avoid Harsh Light: We all love to shoot in natural light; however, the sunniest part of the day is the worst time of day to shoot. While that time of day is hard to avoid, try to shoot in the shade as much as possible or use a diffuser to soften the light. If there are clouds, wait for them to block the sun's rays.
- 2. Plan for the Golden Hour/Blue Hour: An hour or so before sunset or after sunrise is a great time to be out as the light will be soft and warm. If you're out during the evening golden hour, don't leave too early because just before nightfall, known as the blue hour, the light can be just as impressive.





- 3. Do Some Wandering: Don't be afraid to get your hands dirty or your feet wet to find a unique spot. Travel off the beaten path even if it's just your local park, but be sure to follow all the rules. There are lots of out of the way places to explore.
- 4. Look for Unusual Conditions: Watch the weather. Plan your outings according to the forecast. Rain and stormy conditions can provide for very moody landscapes as well as some stunning reflections.
- 5. Experiment with Long Exposures: Waterfalls, streams and ocean waves are calling for long exposures. Slower shutter speeds go hand in hand in transforming those water features into that silky smooth look. Don't forget to bring along a tripod and neutral density filter so you can leave that shutter open longer.

I could go on and on but that's just a few recommendations that I have found helpful. So enjoy your summer and most of all keep shooting.



#### **Walter Fluegel**

When my parents lived in Duluth (I grew up there, but I think this is after I left in 1974) they were members of a photography club. I'm assuming that might be Duluth Superior Camera Club. They were quite active, my father Walter Fluegel serving as president for a while - I suppose that might have been the late 1970s or early 1980s - they moved to Minneapolis in 1985. I helped them with the Nomargo Ashmore, Publisher

Walt was 94 when he passed away on April 6, 2022. Maxine, my mom, passed on May 10, 2010.



Walt Fluegel 1928-2022

Walter Fluegel was born March 16, 1928 to Johanna (Gunther) and Johannes Walter Fluegel in Mulheim an der Ruhr, Germany. After Johannes died, Johanna went to America to live with a sister, eventually putting baby Walter in care of the Wartburg orphanage in Mount Vernon, NY.

In his mid-teen through high school years (A.B. Davis), son and mother lived on North Fulton Avenue in Mount Vernon. While at the University of Alaska (Fairbanks area), he built her a home there. He had many jobs and enterprises in his youth, including greenhouse, seashell jewelry maker, construction, and barber.

In 1953, Walt traveled from Alaska to Washington, DC promoting Alaska for Statehood, giving slide show lectures for \$10 and a place to stay. He visited factories to "see what makes America tick."

While getting his Master's degree at the agricultural college in Fargo, North Dakota he met Maxine Lott and they married for life. Walt taught college biology and other natural sciences. They lived in Duluth, Roseville, Ashland Oregon and then Duluth, Minnesota again before retiring to Grantsburg, Wisconsin to get away from big-city pollution. They remodeled and redecorated several homes and tended their gardens.

Both enjoyed photography, with Walt in later years using photographic resources to provide color and shape which he would distort and repeat into computer-Photoshopped creations. Walt and Max were members of photography clubs in Duluth, North Metro (Twin Cities, MN) and Northern Exposures. They judged together for other photo clubs, presenting results like Siskell-and-Ebert, not always agreeing. For years they supplied the Grantsburg Public Library with a new display of their arts every few months.

Walt is survived by offspring Margo Ashmore and Grey Fluegel, grandchildren Karl and Larissa. Widowed in 2010, Walt, always the teacher, continued to write and self-publish books based on his life. His late-life caregivers appreciated "the professor," his stories and art.

nesota Anatomy Bequest Program. He would be proud to know he will continue to teach as a resource for students of physical therapy.
