Paul,

I'm not sure how I got on this email chain, but happy to add my two cents.

The Omaha Camera Club was established in 1925 and is a charter member of N4C. OCC's participation with N4C has been somewhat erratic over the years, ranging from Club of the Year winner and Photographer of the Year, to basically no involvement.

At the time I became the Club's N4C rep, about 6 years ago, there was maybe one or two digital entries from our club per year – nobody in the club seemed to know or care what was going on at N4C. We would have our monthly club contests and go about our business. I had no idea what skill level was common in the N4C digital contests, but knew that the former club N4C rep was a much better photographer than I was. Oh well, I thought, since I'm the new N4C rep, I should probably enter a few contests to see how the system works.

I got a few other members to join me in the monthly N4C contests, and once one of them earned an award and showed that our club could compete at that level, many more members gave it a try. Now, we have more entries than the eight/club allowance in each category, so we have a "runoff" to decide which photos are entered. The competition has helped everyone in the club improve their skills. What helped generate more interest in both club and N4C competitions was the willingness of members to provide comments on photos, especially the group that enters N4C contests as they are more open and willing to critique each others' work.

The majority of our membership is still reluctant to provide "unvarnished" comments, either because they don't feel competent or don't want to hurt anyone's feelings. Anonymous comments are easier to give and receive, which brings me to a suggestion to help both clubs, CCC and OCC. Paul, would your club be willing to judge one of OCC's monthly digital contests, and provide comments on each entry? We, of course, would do the same for CCC.

In my opinion, the N4C contests do not provide enough feedback, and not enough emphasis is placed on the education value of competing. I hear comments like, "It takes too much time" or "This is a contest, not a classroom". Yes, judging a N4C digital contest is a real time commitment, but there is also an educational element to judging; i.e. expressing what you see in a photo. Expressing what you see in a photo sharpens your awareness of what you're doing behind the lens. And Paul, with your military background, I know you can understand how hard it is to change "this is the way we've always done it" atmosphere.

Paul, let me know if you have any interest in sharing experiences with the Omaha Camera Club.

MINUTES OF THE N4C ANNUAL BUSINESS MEETING, SEPTEMBER 15, 2018

The Annual Business Meeting of the North Central Camera Club Council was called to order at 1:00 p.m., Saturday, September 15, 2018, by President Bob Lahti, in the Iowa Room of the Holiday Inn, Dubuque, Iowa. Ten Officers and Directors were present. Terry Butler was absent. Convention Co-Chairmen Ron and Jennifer Tigges were applauded. Convention attendance is 117.

Wilford Yoder described changes to the Service Awards Committee this year, recorded in the new N4C Directory. Steve Thompson will be the new Chairman of the Service Awards Committee, and SuAnn Tichy will be a new committee member. A Service Award will be presented tonight by Steve. Wilford's 10 years as Chairman were applicated.

The amended minutes of the May 4, 2018 Spring Mini-Convention Board Meeting were mailed to Officers, Directors, and Chairmen by Pat Schwope, Secretary. A motion to approve the amended minutes as received was made by Pat Schwope, seconded by Lynda Richards, and carried.

The 2018-2019 Officers and Directors who will take office following the Banquet on Saturday night are: President, Debbie Bates; 1st Vice President, Mark Gromko; 2nd Vice President, John Larson, Jr.; Secretary, Pat Schwope; Treasurer, Lynda Richards; Director No. 1, Doug Conrad; Director No. 2, Greg Hoglund; Director No. 3, Paul Hagen; Director No. 4, Paul Grillo; Director No. 5, Terry Butler; Director No. 6, Dwight Corrin.

The Financial Report from August 1, 2017 through July 31, 2018, audited by Sharon Allen on September 6, 2018, was read by Lynda Richards, Treasurer. Checking Balance On Hand July 31, 2017: \$4,605.58. Receipts: \$8,492.71. Expenses: \$8,931.17. Checking Balance On Hand July 31, 2018: \$4,167.12. The \$8,212.21 Certificate of Deposit was reinvested at People's Bank, Carlisle, Iowa, on May 15, 2015, at 1.50% for 24 months, to mature on May 15, 2019. Net Worth As Of July 31, 2018: \$12,379.33. A motion to approve the Financial Report was made by Lynda Richards, seconded by Pat Schwope, and carried. 2018-2019 dues from 14 clubs have not yet been paid. The Convention host club pays for engraving the medals, which are furnished by N4C.

Carl Hardy and Mark Gromko were applauded for getting the N4C Handbook and Directory corrections made up to speed.

Old Business: Larry Meister announced that the 2019 Spring Mini-Convention will be held at Wesley Woods in Indianola, Iowa (25 miles south of Des Moines), on May 3, 4, and 5. He has signed a two-year contract with Wesley Woods; in 2020, the dates will be April 26, 27, and 28. Dorm rooms are available; bedding and towels must be brought by the user. A campground is available. Indianola has 3 motels, and is 12 miles from Wesley Woods. Registration will go up \$10 to \$20; there will be no Sunday lunch. During the coming year, Larry will be training Randy Moyer in his position. Pictures of Wesley Woods were projected by Ken Johnson. The road that goes to Wesley Woods is off of State Highway 92, which goes from East to West. It is on the West side of Indianola. There is a big Catholic church on the corner where you turn South off of 92. It is about 6-7 miles from there.

Bob Lahti thanked Ken Johnson, Larry Meister, Lynda Richards, and Dwight Tomes for taking the time to check out Wesley Woods.

Ken Johnson had a proposal for digital contests only, not for print contests, to give an option for how clubs want to handle ribbons.

Ken Johnson proposed that Digital contest N4C awards will be administered by the entering club, based on the contest winner results from the judging club. Entering clubs will obtain an inventory of ribbons and Merit Awards from the N4C Supply Officer around the time of the Spring Mini-Convention, in sufficient quantity needed for the following contest season. The awards will be labeled and distributed by the entering club's N4C Digital Contact to their winning club members when contest results naming the award recipients are received from the judging clubs. This will be effective next judging season: 2019-2020. Mark Grillo made a motion to accept Ken's proposal; seconded by Lynda Richards, and carried, with 1 opposed.

MINUTES OF THE N4C ANNUAL BUSINESS MEETING, SEPTEMBER 15, 2018 continued

New Business: Debbie Bates said we are coming up with ideas to help educate the different clubs. We are putting presentations on Dropbox, to send on to any club that wants to be able to use that information. Other clubs can add to that, to make it available each month, with different ideas for all clubs to use. Let Ken Johnson or Dwight Tomes know if you have anything which can be shared. A motion was then made by Dwight Tomes and seconded by Greg Hoglund to have a Dropbox for N4C for the education program. Motion carried.

File size for digital submissions. Dwight Tomes and Mark Gromko want to increase the file size from 1024 to 1920, to increase the number of pixels by one-third, without increasing file size. The final recommendation is to increase maximum file size allowed from 500K to 750K. We are talking about perceptible difference at 100%. We should not be oversizing things. The motion was made and seconded, to increase the file size from 500K to 750K, for digital competition, effective next month (October 2018). Motion carried.

How to improve interaction between clubs. We have had several clubs say that N4C does not give them enough, so they are dropping out. We need to find ways to interact with each other. Get another club to try to help you out.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 2:25 pm.
